Figure A.1(a): Predicted discrimination attitudes for men and women, by income (including controls for left-right and liberal-authoritarian values)




Figure A.1(b): Predicted discrimination attitudes for men and women, by income (excluding controls for left-right and liberal-authoritarian values)




Figure A.1(c): Predicted discrimination attitudes for men and women, by education (including controls for left-right and liberal-authoritarian values)




Figure A.1(d): Predicted discrimination attitudes for men and women, by education (excluding controls for left-right and liberal-authoritarian values)




Figure A.1(e): Predicted discrimination attitudes for men and women, by subjective social class (including controls for left-right and liberal-authoritarian values)




Figure A2 (a): Polynomial distribution of male discrimination perceptions by gender and age




Figure A2 (b): Polynomial distribution of female discrimination perceptions by gender and age



Figure A3. Marginal effect on voting leave across perceptions of discrimination against men, by gender, age, and employment status




Figure A4: OLS regression with EU integration preferences scale as dependent variable, with same model specification as table A3.
